Request for Proposal

Proposals are invited from either an individual or group in the Senior School for a charitable endeavour organized and run by HGS Senior School students (2010-11) to be considered for the Gordon Stirrett & Associates Community Award.

The purpose of the Award is to provide annual seed money (or a grant) to fund a project or series of projects. The Award intends to encourage and support student initiatives, particularly those demonstrating fresh thinking and entrepreneurship. Proposed projects may be local, regional, or global in their focus. The Feed Nova Scotia initiative and the Global Awareness Conference are prime examples of such worthy projects. All proposals must be written in form and provide a clear case for support.

Guidelines for Submission:

1. Description of Initiative (150-200 words)
2. Request for Funds (\$1,000) complete with justification for expenses and budget.
3. Timeline for the execution of the project.
4. Names of organizers, participants, including community involvement.
5. Goal and purpose of the project.

Eligibility:

The award is open to HGS students who will be in Senior School in 2010-2011.

June 1, 2010

October 1, 2010
